The influence of Adam's sin

"You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat of it you will surely die." Genesis 2:16-17

The purpose of the law was to make men aware of how sinful they were and how much they needed a Savior.

Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and <u>in this way</u> <u>death came to all men</u>, because all sinned—

Romans 5:12

We are not all guilty of sin because of Adam's sin.

We are all under a death sentence because of Adam's sin.

Nevertheless, death reigned from the time of Adam to the time of Moses, even over those who did not sin by breaking a command, as did Adam, who was a pattern of the one to come.

Romans 5:14

The reason that death is in the world is because Adam sinned and was separated from the tree of life.

Paul makes the analogy and comparison between Adam and Christ to show the superiority of grace. Just as sin entered the world through Adam's disobedience, Grace entered the world through Christ's obedience.

But the gift is not like the trespass. For if the many died by the trespass of the one man, how much more did God's grace and the gift that came by the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ, overflow to the many! Romans 5:15

And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death—even death on a cross! Philippians 2:8

The law was added so that the trespass might increase. But where sin increased, grace increased all the more, Romans 5:20

For if, by the trespass of the one man, death reigned through that one man, how much more will those who receive God's abundant provision of grace and of the gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man, Jesus Christ. Rom. 5:17

"I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in me will live, even though he dies **John 11:25**

And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ are lost. If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men. 1 Cor. 15:17-19

But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive. 1 Corinthians 15:20-22

Death has been swallowed up in victory."
"Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O
death, is your sting?" The sting of death is sin,
and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to
God! He gives us the victory through our Lord
Jesus Christ. 1 Corinthians 15:54-57

The law was added so that the trespass might increase. But where sin increased, grace increased all the more, so that, just as sin reigned in death, so also grace might reign through righteousness to bring eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. Romans 5:20-21

Placing our own words into the mouth of the Holy Spirit. "God's Spirit is saying..."
All the while, presuming to speak on behalf of the Holy Spirit

Focus and meditate on the Power of God's Grace

Pray specifically.
