The Church began on the day of Pentecost

Pentecost means, 50 days after Passover

"Men of Israel, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. Acts 2:22

This man was handed over to you by God's set purpose and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. **Acts 2:23**

But God raised him from the dead Acts 2:24a

"Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Christ." Acts 2:36

When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, what shall we do?" Acts 2:37

Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Acts 2:38

Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day. Acts 2:41

As a result, people brought the sick into the streets and laid them on beds and mats so that at least Peter's shadow might fall on some of them as he passed by. **Acts 5:15**

Crowds gathered also from the towns around Jerusalem, bringing their sick and those tormented by evil spirits, and all of them were healed. **Acts 5:16**

On that day a great persecution broke out against the church at Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered throughout Judea and Samaria. Acts 8:1

As Peter entered the house, Cornelius met him and fell at his feet in reverence. But Peter made				
him get up. "Stand up," he said, "I am only a man myself." Acts 10:25-26				

While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit came on all who heard the message. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles. For they heard them speaking in tongues and praising God. Acts 10:44-46

Then Peter said, "Can anyone keep these people from being baptized with water? They have received the Holy Spirit just as we have." Acts 10:47

Two barriers to the Jews in accepting Jesus

- 1. The Messiah was not a political Messiah
- 2. Jesus came not just for the Jews, but he also came for the Gentiles

Saul's (Paul) Conversion • Acts 9, 22, 26

As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" Acts 9:3-4

"Who are you, Lord?" Saul asked.

"I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," Acts 9:5

Jesus said you go to Damascus and you'll be told what to do and when he got up he was blind. "Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do." Acts 9:6

The men traveling with Saul stood there speechless; they heard the sound but did not see anyone. Saul got up from the ground, but when he opened his eyes he could see nothing. So they led him by the hand into Damascus. Acts 9:7-8

"Brother Saul, the Lord—Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you were coming here—has sent me so that you may see again and be filled with the Holy Spirit." Immediately, something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he could see again. He got up and was baptized, Acts 9:17b-18
