The Bible is unique

- It is a library of 66 books
- Written by 40 different authors
- Over a period of 1500 years

Review from last week...

1. Adam brought a curse on the world, because he sinned against God.

- Woman—pain in childbirth, chafe under the power-play of her husband.
- Man—difficulty in labor, resistant environment, eventually die because of sin.

Four Leaders from Conquest to Captivity.

1. Joshua

The Israelites grieved for Moses in the plains of Moab thirty days, until the time of weeping and mourning was over. Now Joshua son of Nun was filled with the spirit of wisdom because Moses had laid his hands on him. So the Israelites listened to him and did what the Lord had commanded Moses. **Deuteronomy 34:8-9**

After the death of Moses the servant of the Lord, the Lord said to Joshua son of Nun, Moses' aide: "Moses my servant is dead. Now then, you and all these people, get ready to cross the Jordan River into the land I am about to give to them—to the Israelites.

Joshua 1:1-2

I will give you every place where you set your foot, as I promised Moses. Your territory will extend from the desert to Lebanon, and from the great river, the Euphrates—all the Hittite country—to the Great Sea on the west. **Joshua 1:3-4**

No one will be able to stand up against you all the days of your life. As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will never leave you nor forsake you. Joshua 1:5

"Be strong and courageous, because you will lead these people to inherit the land I swore to their forefathers to give them. Joshua 1:6

Then they answered Joshua, "Whatever you have commanded us we will do, and wherever you send us we will go. Joshua 1:16

2. King David

Four Leaders from Conquest to Captivity.

Theme of King David is, K

David then took up residence in the fortress and called it the City of David. He built up the area around it, from the supporting terraces inward. **2 Samuel 5:9**

And he became more and more powerful, because the Lord God Almighty was with him. **2 Samuel 5:10**

David's kingship in its accomplishments and g_____

- David conquers Jerusalem;
- David defeats the Philistines;
- David brings the Arc back to Jerusalem;
- David promises an everlasting dynasty;
- The extension of David's kingdom externally and the justice of his rule internally;
- David's faithfulness to his covenant with Jonathon."

David's son, Solomon

- Wisdom, wealth, and peace
- 700 wives, 300 concubines
- Tolerated the foreign gods of his wives
- Israel began to worship false gods

3. The Prophet Elijah

Theme of Elijah is, C_____

Solomon's son, Rehoboam

- Over taxation, greed
- The nation is split in two

Civil w_____ in the Land of Israel

- 10 Northern tribes appoint Jeroboam king—called Israel
- 2 Southern tribes, David's line—called Judah (Rehoboam)

King Ahab and Jezebel

- Elijah holds back the rain 3 ½ years
- Battle between ba'al and God

"How long will you waver between two opinions? If the Lord is God, follow him; but if Baal is God, follow him."
But the people said nothing. 1 Kings 18:21

Then Elijah said to them, "I am the only one of the Lord's prophets left, but Baal has four hundred and fifty prophets. Get two bulls for us. Let them choose one for themselves, and let them cut it into pieces and put it on the wood but not set fire to it. I will prepare the other bull and put it on the wood but not set fire to it. 1 Kings 18:22-23

Then you call on the name of your god, and I will call on the name of the Lord. The god who answers by fire—he is God." 1 Kings 18:24

Answer me, O Lord, answer me, so these people will know that you, O Lord, are God, and that you are turning their hearts back again." 1 Kings 18:37

Then the fire of the Lord fell and burned up the sacrifice, the wood, the stones and the soil, and also licked up the water in the trench. When all the people saw this, they fell prostrate and cried, "The Lord—he is God! The Lord—he is God!" 1 Kings 18:38-39

The Prophet Elisha

- God sent Elisha to encourage and help
- Elijah's power is passed on to Elisha
- Elijah and Elisha called for repentance—the people persisted in sin and corruption

Judgment and C______

- Northern kingdom of Israel captured by Assyrians in 722 BC
- Southern Kingdom of Judah taken by Babylonians in 586 BC

God spared a R_____

- God's covenant, all the nations of the world would be blessed through Jews
 —the Savior would come from Abraham
- People true to God in captivity, Daniel, Esther, Shadrack, Meshach, and Abednego
- Persians allow Jews to return to Jerusalem

4. Nehemiah

Four Leaders from Conquest to Captivity.

Then I said to them, "You see the trouble we are in: Jerusalem lies in ruins, and its gates have been burned with fire. Come, let us rebuild the wall of Jerusalem, and we will no longer be in disgrace." **Nehemiah 2:17**

I also told them about the gracious hand of my God upon me and what the king had said to me.

They replied, "Let us start rebuilding." So they began this good work. **Nehemiah 2:18**

Major Prophets

- Big preachers, little preachers
