1. Paul warns against idleness in our work.

Paul's warnings against laziness in 2 Thessalonians 3

In the name of the Lord Jesus
Christ, we command you, brothers,
to keep away from every brother
who is idle and does not live
according to the teaching you
received from us.

2 Thessalonians 3:6

For you yourselves know how you ought to follow our example. We were not idle when we were with you, nor did we eat anyone's food without paying for it. On the contrary, we worked night and day, laboring and toiling so that we would not be a burden to any of you. 2 Thessalonians 3:7-8

We did this, not because we do not have the right to such help, but in order to make ourselves a model for you to follow. For even when we were with you, we gave you this rule: "If a man will not work, he shall not eat."

2 Thessalonians 3:9-10

If anyone does not obey our instruction in this letter, take special note of him. Do not associate with him, in order that he may feel ashamed. Yet do not regard him as an enemy, but warn him as a brother.

The Character of a Lazy Person, as described in Proverbs

Go to the ant, you sluggard; consider its ways and be wise! It has no commander, no overseer or ruler, yet it stores its provisions in summer and gathers its food at harvest. **Proverbs 6:6-8**

How long will you lie there, you sluggard? When will you get up from your sleep? A little sleep, a little slumber, a little folding of the hands to rest— and poverty will come on you like a bandit and scarcity like an armed man.

Proverbs 6:9-11

The Slothful Person is Never Fulfilled.

The sluggard craves and gets nothing, but the desires of the diligent are fully satisfied.

Proverbs 13:4

The sluggard's craving will be the death of him, because his hands refuse to work. All day long he craves for more, but the righteous give without sparing.

Proverbs 21:25-26

The Slothful Person Lacks Strength.

The sluggard buries his hand in the dish; he is too lazy to bring it back to his mouth. **Proverbs 26:15**

The Slothful Person Lacks Prosperity.

for drunkards and gluttons become poor, and drowsiness clothes them in rags. **Proverbs 23:21**
