

BREAK OUT OF YOUR COMFORT ZONE

This portion of the homework is not optional. To receive the maximum benefit from this course, you must commit to completing the “Break Out of Your Comfort Zone” activities. The at-home assignment will prepare you for taking the next step – applying what you’re learning in the real world. They’re not tough or time-consuming, but are very important in easing you out of your comfort zone. **You will also be expected to share your experiences during the next session.**

1. At-Home Preparation: Imagine that you are sound asleep in bed, and your house is on fire. There’s a fire station next door. What virtues would you want the firefighters to have? Write them down (alertness, training, courage, concern for others, etc.). Ask yourself whether you have those necessary virtues as a Christian. Indicate which ones you think you possess and which you need to work on.
2. Real-World Application: Call two people from your church and say, “I’m taking an evangelism course called ‘The Way of the Master and as part of the homework, I need to ask someone a few questions. Can you help me with this?” Then ask the following questions:
 - Do you share your faith regularly? Do you go out of your way to verbally share the gospel with strangers?
 - If not, is there any reason why you don’t?
 - What is the main reason you don’t share your faith more often?

Write down their answers and bring them to the next session.

FOR DEEPER STUDY

While completing this section of the homework is not essential to enjoy this course, we highly recommend that you do as much as possible. God's Word is powerful and in searching it you will discover wonderful truths that reinforce what you're learning in class.

1. Read Jeremiah 1:5–10. Do you think that God's intimate knowledge of Jeremiah (verse 5) was confined to him, or do you think God has this same knowledge of all of us (see Psalm 139)?
2. What was Jeremiah's response to the knowledge that God had set him apart for His purposes (verse 6)?
3. What was the real reason underlying Jeremiah's excuse (verse 8)?
4. What is your initial reaction to the thought that God wants to use you to reach the lost? If you are fearful, what do you fear?
5. What assurances does God give Jeremiah in these verses?
6. Read Exodus 3:11 and 4:10
What excuses did Moses give when God wanted to use him?

What assurances did God give him (see 3:12 and 4:11, 12)?

7. When God called Gideon, what was his excuse (see Judges 6:15)?

Read Judges 6 25 – 27 Why did Gideon do what God wanted him to do at night?

8. What assurances did God give Gideon (vv. 14, 16)?

9. Read 1 Corinthians 2:1 – 5. How did Paul feel when he preached?

Can you identify with Paul? Why do you think he did it anyway?

10. According to verses 4, 5, why would people call such unqualified people as Paul, Jeremiah, Moses, Gideon, ... and you?

11. Read and explain these verses in your own words. Proverbs 29:25; Deuteronomy 3 1:6; Isaiah 41:10.

Read Philippians 4:13, and explain the meaning of the word "all."

In light of God's promises to be with you and help you, and in light of His love expressed to you on the cross, can you think of any legitimate excuse for not being and true and faithful witness of Jesus Christ? List here:

"And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment"
Hebrews 9:27 (NKJV)

Words of Encouragement

I have been studying the Way of the Master now for 3 weeks and have seen God work in miraculous ways! I could hardly wait to go to the train station to begin sharing the gospel with people. That very first day, the second person I spoke with a girl in her early twenties, accepted Christ!

She was so happy and full of joy as I Left! She could not thank me enough! She just kept saying, "Thankyouson! Thankyouson!" How this made me praise God! It also helped me to see that God often does the ice-breaking when we are prepared and available for Him to use!

I can't thank you enough for your ministry. This biblical method of evangelism has revolutionized my service to God, my perspective of His holiness, and my love and compassion for people. There is nothing more urgent, important, or exhilarating than being used by Him in this way: calling others to -repentance and to Him.
