13. What were these creatures, according to our author in the next to the last paragraph on page 25?
14. How does the author describe these “mash-up” creatures in Ezekiel 28:12, 14-15, 17 (middle of page 26)?
15. “The Lord has told us all we need to know, but He certainly hasn't told us all there is. As Paul wrote, "For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then face to face.” (27) What's up with the different faces? What are some

different ideas the author gives about them, found in Ezekiel 1:15-18?
